The new ministry of Education requirement for Grade 3 has been met with full compliance. The first assessment targeted the student's ability on hygiene and environmental studies. This exercise took place in the first week of August and subsequent assessments will follow in September and October.

Three sets of examinations were done at the end of May, June and July; the last in July was the end of term examinations. These examinations provide the teaching staff with a good basis to track students' understanding of class lessons.


Staff News


