




In January, DGS received letters from a UK school that were spread out across different classes. A PowerPoint presentation from the school preceded the exercise where the children were treated with drinks and snacks.

DGS is located in Mombasa (South Coast of Kenya) with its main access point being the Likoni ferry channel. The massive population in tens of thousands crossing the Likoni ferry everyday to look for work go through delays and congestion. With the adaptation of the mandatory social distancing rule, the ferries have to carry just enough passengers. This is causing serious delays meaning the few people able to go to work do so with many challenges.

The COVID-19 Pandemic Situation Report

DGS can confirm that there are no fatalities among the staffs, students, parents or guardians. When positive cases went on the rise, the Kenyan government like other governments shut down all schools and eventually only essential service providers continued operating. A national curfew and lockdown in major cities like Mombasa was enforced and continuously extended to date. Most people have been indoors to date with no form of livelihood. This situation birthed the food donation drives to cater for DGS needy families.

The first food parcel donations drive exercise was held in April 2020. Food was packaged and distributed to parents and guardians. DGS sponsors and supporters made the distribution of food parcels possible. DGS staff members volunteered to oversee the operations which went on very well.
